Measures of Inequality

GINI

GINI, or the Gini index, is a measure of the extent to which the distribution of welfare deviates from a perfectly equal distribution. A Gini index score of 0 implies perfect equality, whereas a score of 1 implies perfect inequality (i.e. all resources belong to one household).

Each color represents a cluster of similar values.

- 0.22 - 0.24
- 0.24 - 0.25
- 0.25 - 0.26
- 0.26 - 0.27
- 0.27 - 0.51
